








# INTERACTIVE DOG TOYS

	<p><b>SNUFFLE MAT</b></p> <p>These feeders engage a dog's brain &amp; nose!</p> <p>Tuck kibble or treats among all the the "fingers" of fabric for your dog to find.</p> <p>These are available at Oconomowoc Animal Hospital, Amazon, Etsy or you can find a DIY tutorial on YouTube!</p>
	<p><b>STARMARK BOB-A-LOT</b></p> <p>The Bob-A-Lot is an easy-to-load treat and kibble dispenser. Simply unscrew the yellow top, add kibble, and adjust the dispensing window.</p> <p>Your dog knocks the dispenser around and picks up the kibble that fall out.</p> <p>Bob-A-Lots can be found online.</p>
	<p><b>KONG WOBBLER</b></p> <p>Similar to the Bob-A-Lot, the top <math>\frac{3}{4}</math> unscrews from the weighted bottom so you can add kibble.</p> <p>Your dog knocks the dispenser around and eats up the kibble that falls out.</p> <p>These can be found online.</p>
	<p><b>OMEGA TREAT BALL</b></p> <p>Fill this ball with kibble and watch your dog roll it around to get the treats to fall out.</p> <p>This ball comes in 3 different sizes</p> <p>The Omega Treat Ball can be found online and similar products can be found at local pet stores.</p>
	<p><b>NORTHMATE INTERACTIVE FEEDER</b></p> <p>This bowl slows down even the most voracious eater.</p> <p>Sprinkle the kibble around the pegs and watch your dog puzzle it out.</p> <p>These bowls are dishwasher safe and even recyclable!</p> <p>This can be found online, but similar products can be found at local pet stores.</p>
